## **Insurance Funding Options for Assistive Technology**

Government programs (whether Social Security, Veteran's benefits or state Medicaid agencies) pay for certain assistive technology, if prescribed by a doctor as a necessary medical device.

#### Medicare

National social insurance program for adults over the age of 65 and for younger people with disabilities. May pay for AT under certain circumstances.

Federally-funded insurance program for low-income adults, their children and people with disabilities. They can pay for assistive technology if it is deemed medically necessary.

#### **Medicare Waiver**
